(Applicants must provide a strong rationale for a shorter time.) A main purpose of this award is to help prepare MSU graduate students to develop competitive dissertation proposals in national fellowship competitions of the Fulbright, NSF, SSRC and similar programs. Award amount (from \$1,000 to \$5,000) determined by cost of the travel and related expenses. ● **Walker Hill International Scholarship** – For predissertation visits to the site of the doctoral research in a country outside the U.S. (For international students, research in one's own country does not qualify.) Financial need may be considered. *Deadline: normally January; not announced for 2010.* <http://isp.msu.edu/funding/walker.htm>

Whittier Endowed International Health Scholarship Fund – Six \$500 awards for MSU graduate students (Masters or PhD Level) or students in the MSU College of Osteopathic Medicine or Human Medicine, or an MSU professional student for international health research (graduate level) or international health clerkships. MSU Gender, Justice, and Environmental Change Fellowships – Dissertation research and completion fellowships. Projects must address gender dimensions of environmental and/or agricultural change. \$10,000. Three awarded annually. *Deadline: April 16 annually.* <http://gjec.msu.edu/fellowships.htm>

III. A. Individual Grant Opportunities funded by the U.S. Government Agencies

Fulbright U.S. Student Program for Study or Dissertation Research Abroad ("Fulbright IIE award") – Offers 9-12 months to recent BS/BA graduates (graduating seniors), master's and doctoral students, young professionals, and artists for opportunities for personal development and international experience. Awards provide round-trip transportation, language or orientation courses where appropriate, maintenance allowance, and supplemental health and accidental insurance. Applicants must be U.S. citizens or have a "green card." Current MSU students must submit applications through MSU. Fulbright-Hays Doctoral Dissertation Research Abroad (DDRA) Fellowship Program (US/ED) – For circa 115 fellowships of \$10,000-\$70,000 (averaging \$27,000) for graduate students spending 6-12 months in full-time dissertation research abroad in modern foreign languages and area studies. Applications must be submitted through MSU. Jacob K. Javits Fellowship – Up to four years of support for graduate study at the doctoral or Master of Fine Arts level in a selected field of the arts, humanities, or social sciences. Eligibility is limited to U.S. citizens and permanent residents or any citizens of any one of the Freely Associated States. For fiscal year 2010, the maximum stipend will be \$30,000, and the institutional payment is estimated to be \$13,755. *Deadline: October 5, 2009.* <http://www.ed.gov/programs/jacobjavits/index.html>

International Research and Exchanges Board (IREX) Awards – U.S. citizens who are affiliated full-time with a North American college or university are eligible for academic exchange programs in Central and Eastern Europe, Eurasia, and Mongolia. National Science Foundation – Graduate students may benefit from NSF directly through dissertation support or indirectly through awards made to faculty. NSF **Doctoral Dissertation Research Improvement (DDRI)** awards are made by various NSF Directorates and Divisions, with *varying deadlines, beginning July 31, 2009.* Citizenship for DDRI awards is unrestricted. Submission of DDRI awards must be done electronically via Fastlane, with faculty advisor as PI and must be completed by the MSU Contract and Grant Administration (CGA) office; leave at least 7-to-10 days to manage electronic submission. • **Directorate for Social, Behavioral, and Economic Sciences (SBE) DDRI awards** – Awards are made in the following fields: archaeology; cultural anthropology; physical anthropology; economics; geography; linguistics; political science; sociology; law and social science; Decision, Risk & Management Sciences; Methodology, Measurement, and Statistics; Research on Science and Technology Surveys and Statistics; Science, Technology, and Society; and Science of Science and Innovation Policy. *Deadlines vary.*

• **Developing Global Scientists and Engineers: International Research Experiences for Students (IRES) and Doctoral Dissertation Enhancement Projects (DDEP)** – IRES supports research by groups of U.S. undergraduate or graduate students in collaboration with international partners. Proposals must be submitted by a faculty advisor for activities beginning at least six months after the target date. DDEP is for individual dissertation research with one international collaborator. *Deadline for DDEP: continuous; for IRES: full proposal target dates of September 15 and February 15 annually.*

• **The East Asia and Pacific Summer Institutes** – Provides graduate students with first-hand research experience in Australia, China, Japan, Korea, New Zealand or Taiwan. For Master's, medical, or doctoral students at any stage. \$5,000 plus travel funding. *Deadline: December 9, 2009.*

• **Dissertation Initiative for the Advancement of Climate Change Research (DISCCRS)** – Connects natural and social scientists engaged in research related to climate change. Annual symposium (on March 13-20, 2010) is designed to foster interdisciplinary understanding, communication, career-development and networking. • **NSF Graduate Research Fellowship Program (GRFP)** - Provides three years of support for graduate study leading to research-based master's or doctoral degrees and is intended for students who are in the early stages of their graduate study. U.S. Institute for Peace, Peace Scholar Fellowships – Dissertation research and writing in all disciplines regarding sources and nature of international conflict, especially. policy-relevant, and ways to prevent or end conflict and to sustain peace. \$17,000 for one year. Inter-American Foundation's Grassroots Development Fellowships Program – Fellowships for PhD candidates at U.S. universities for dissertation research that examines "the efforts of the rural and urban poor to improve their lives, their methods of organization and production, and the policies and programs designed to alleviate their poverty." *Deadline: December 31, 2009.* <http://www.iie.org/Website/WPreview.cfm?WID=187>

Borlaug Leadership Enhancement in Agriculture Program (LEAP) – A USAID-funded fellowship program aimed at supporting thesis research of graduate students from selected countries in Sub-Saharan Africa. An important feature of the program is the mentoring role by a CGIAR Center's scientist, along with a counterpart in a US university. *Last deadline was March 11, 2009.* <http://leap.ucdavis.edu>

National Gallery of Art's Center for Advanced Study in the Visual Arts Predoctoral Fellowships – To support doctoral dissertation research in the history, theory, and criticism of art, architecture, and urbanism. Application for these fellowships may be made only through the chair of graduate departments of art history and other appropriate departments, who act as sponsors for applicants from their respective schools. III. B. (1) Funding Opportunities for International Research to be Conducted Abroad

Social Science Research Council (SSRC)

- **Dissertation Proposal Development Fellowship** – A workshop designed to help graduate students in the humanities and social sciences formulate doctoral dissertation proposals. The workshop is organized around distinct "research fields," which vary yearly; the topics are announced in November. For doctoral students in the early phase of their research, generally second and third years. - **International Dissertation Research Fellowship (IDRF)** – Nine to 12 months of support (up to \$20,000) for students in the humanities and social sciences. Must have passed qualifying exams by the time the fellowship begins or by December 2010, whichever comes first. 75 awards. - **Japan Society for the Promotion of Science Fellowship** – ABD doctoral students in the social science and humanities are eligible. Research may concern historical or pre-historic periods, but must be based on excavated materials. Proposals for collaboration with colleagues and institutions across regions are especially encouraged. This program is conducted in cooperation with a competition for institutional awards administered by the Henry Luce Foundation's Asia Program. *Deadline: November 13, 2009.*

The Council on Library and Information Resources (CLIR) Mellon Fellowships for Dissertation Research in Original Sources – Support of up to \$2,000 per month for 9 to 12 months for dissertation research plus an additional \$1,000 upon participating in a symposium on research in original sources and submitting an acceptable

report to CLIR on the research experience. Citizenship: unrestricted. *Deadline: November 13, 2009.*

Graduate Women in Science Fellowships - Sigma Delta Epsilon – For graduate students, postdocs, or junior faculty. For research “in all the natural sciences, including: physical, environmental, mathematical, computer, life sciences, anthropology, psychology and statistics.” \$1,000-\$10,000. 14 awards annually. January 15 (annual).

The Margaret McNamara Memorial Fund (MMMF) – Educational grants for U.S. and Canada and for Africa. awards educational grants to women from developing countries whose graduate studies and future plans aim to benefit women and children in their respective regions. *Deadlines vary.* www.mmmf-grants.org

The World Bank Robert S. McNamara Fellowships Program – Provides support to lecturers and researchers under age 45 working in academic and research institutions from eligible countries preparing a doctoral thesis. Research grants cover residence costs for 5 to 10 months in a renowned university or research center. The Council of American Overseas Research Centers (CAORC) fellowships – For doctoral candidates who have completed all PhD requirements with the exception of the dissertation. The Multi-Country Research Fellowship requires scholars in fields in the humanities, social sciences, or allied natural sciences to conduct research in more than one country, at least one of which hosts a participating American overseas research center.
