# **Undergraduate Research:**

Are you interested in getting involved with undergraduate research at Michigan State University but are unsure of where to start? The <u>Pathway to Research program</u> can help you secure an undergraduate research position with a MSU faculty member.

With both large-group learning sessions and individual advising sessions, the Pathway to Research (PTR) is a free, 3-week program designed to help students obtain research positions. The program has three main goals: (1) identify potential research areas and which faculty members are currently pursuing projects in that field, (2) draft emails to effectively reach out and show interest to prospective research mentors, and (3) practice interview skills.

The PTR Program offers funding\* to support a research experience to students who finish the program. The PTR Program is open to any major.

Gaining research experience during your undergraduate career has significant benefits such as developing enhanced analytical skills, improving communication skills, increased self-confidence, and greater career clarification. Our next cohort begins this summer and will be entirely virtual, so you can participate from anywhere. Get started today by signing up for Pathway to Research using this survey!

Course: ISS 310 - People and Environment - 4 credit hours

In this course, we will explore the intricate realities of Puerto Rico's politics, society, and geography. From the origins of the Taíno indigenous people to Spanish colonization and its current status as an unincorporated territory of the United States, we will delve into the island's diverse history. Our discussions will encompass the ongoing struggle of the Puerto Rican people for political autonomy and representation. Additionally, we will examine the economic challenges facing the island, including debt, economic development strategies, and socio-economic disparities. Furthermore, we will evaluate Puerto Rico's ecological diversity and its vulnerability to climate change and natural disasters. Through immersive experiences in Puerto Rico's vibrant culture, including its music, art, and traditions, students will gain a deeper understanding of resilience in the face of adversity. Hands-on service activities and interactions with migrant and seasonal farm worker students will provide valuable insights into the historical, contemporary, and future challenges shaping Puerto Rico's trajectory.

Program Fee: \$1,200

Includes: ground transportation, accommodation, some meals, stipend, and field trips.

The Fulbright US Student grant competition will open soon! We have **two information sessions for MSU students/recent graduates planned.** Competitive students are interested in living abroad, exploring other cultures, and immersing themselves in a new community. Foreign

language skills and experience abroad are helpful but by no means required. The attached "Qualities of a Competitive Fulbright Candidate" will help identify those among your advisees who might be a good fit.

As MSU's Fulbright Program Advisor, I am here to work with your advisees throughout the application process. For those not familiar with the Fulbright program, this two-minute overview answers the question "What is Fulbright?"

- This is a competitive grant program funded by the US Department of State that **enables US citizen students to do research, study, or teach English abroad**.
- Awards provide round-trip airfare, a maintenance allowance based on living costs in the host country, insurance, and the extraordinary opportunity to live and work in a new country.
- These awards are open to all Spartans who will have a BA/BS by the time the grant would begin in 2025, so students who will be seniors next year can apply if your advisees have longer to go before graduation, they can still think about Fulbright and have plenty of time to plan their application. Masters and PhD students may also apply.
- The competition will open April 2; the MSU deadline is September 1, and the national deadline is in October.

The <u>Fulbright US Student program website</u> is rich with information and resources, and I encourage your advisees to explore it as they think through their options. <u>MSU's Fulbright website</u> also provides information for potential applicants. Students should complete the <u>Fulbright Program Interest Form</u> to connect with me.
